A pre-university diploma

- Honors Diploma
 - Utilizes local and international standards
 - Based on an integrated curriculum
 - Fosters “intercultural literacy”
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What is the International Baccalaureate Diploma?

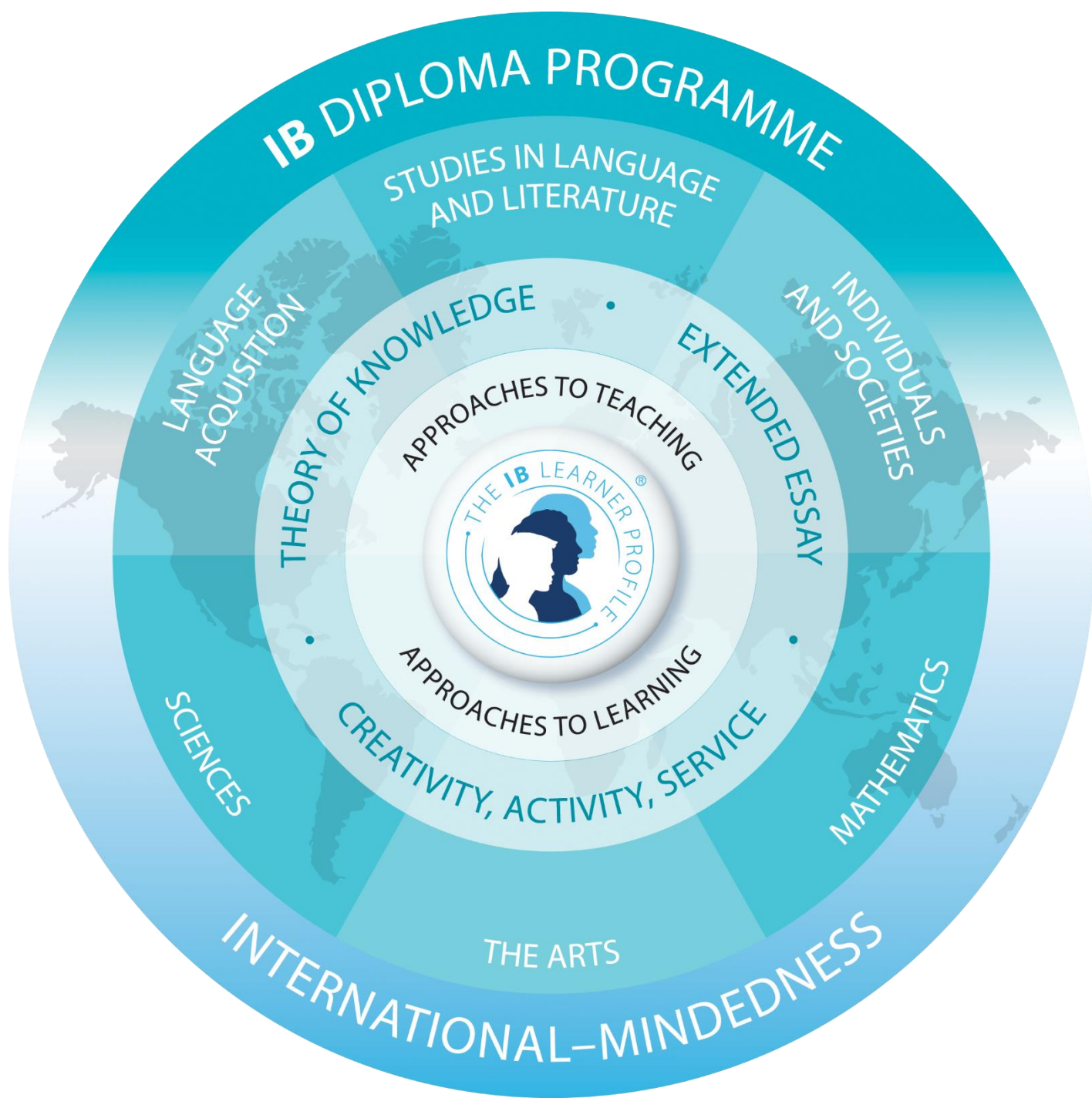
- 3100+ schools in 147 countries; many are International Schools
 - 919 Diploma Programs in the United States alone
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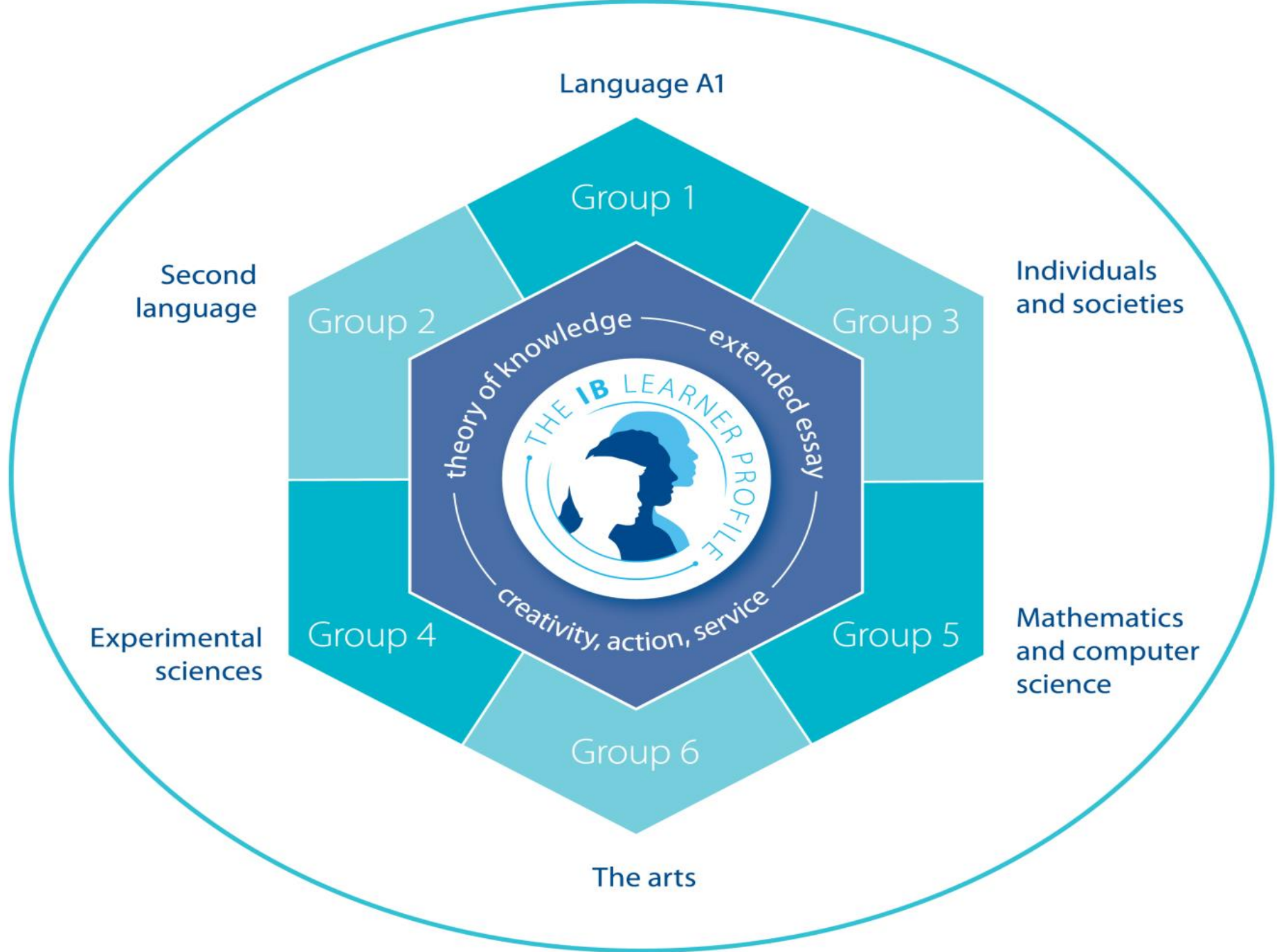
The I.B. uses ***international standards*** to measure student achievement.

To meet the IB Diploma Requirements, students must:

- ❑ take three Higher Level Courses and three Standard Level Courses from each of six core curriculum groups
 - HLs are completed after two years of study (in the Senior Year)
 - SLs are completed after one or two years of study (two may be taken Junior Year)

- ❑ accumulate a minimum of 24 points; each course is graded on a scale of 1 to 7
 - higher grades in one course may be used to make up for lower grades in another course, provided that the total points is 24+

Assessment

- The International Baccalaureate uses multiple assessment methods to measure student achievement in all its courses.
 - internally- and externally-graded assessments, using established grading criteria
 - varied skills are tested across disciplines
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Assessment varies across the disciplines

HL English, Language and Literature

- In-class presentations
- Formal, face-to-face oral
- Four 800-1000 word written assignments
- Two written examinations

Assessment varies across the disciplines

Language B, Spanish or French

- In-class oral presentations
- Face-to-face oral
- Written assignment based on a 'stimulus'
- Written Exam: Text handling
- Written Exam: Essay

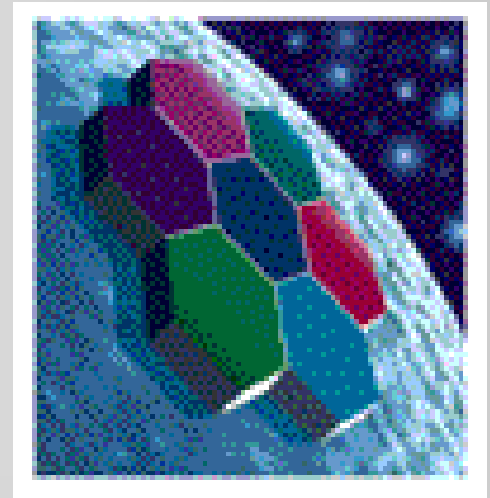
Assessment varies across the disciplines

Experimental Sciences

- Lab Work
- Individual Investigation
- Group Project
- Multiple Choice
- Data-based, short answer and extended response questions

- ❑ Project and investigations in Mathematics

- ❑ Exhibition of 8-11 artworks in Visual Arts
- ❑ Creating and performing in Music

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Creativity, Activity, Service

- ❑ Creativity: arts and other experiences that involve creative thinking
 - ❑ Activity: physical exertion contributing to a healthy lifestyle
 - ❑ Service: an unpaid and voluntary exchange that has a learning benefit for the student
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CAS Guidelines

- ❑ Successful completion of CAS is a requirement for the award of the IB Diploma
 - ❑ Reasonable balance between creativity, activity and service over the course of 18 months
 - ❑ Students must show some evidence of the seven learning outcomes
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Learning Outcomes

1. Identify your own strengths and develop areas for growth
 2. Undertake new challenges and develop new skills in the process
 3. Initiate and plan CAS experiences
 4. Show perseverance and commitment to your CAS experiences
 5. Recognize the benefits of working collaboratively
 6. Engage with issues of global importance
 7. Consider the ethical implications of your choices and actions

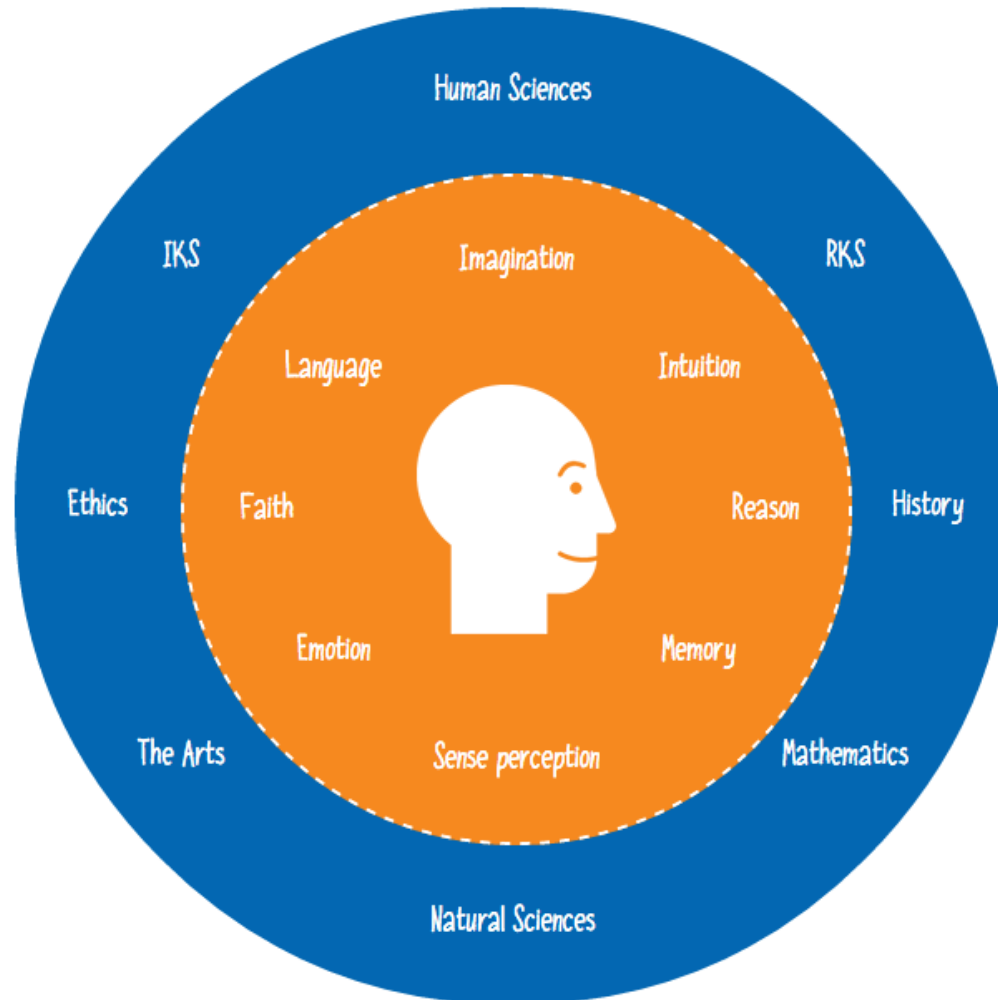

Theory of Knowledge

Aims:

- ❑ Develop a critical capacity to evaluate knowledge claims, and understand why this process is important
 - ❑ Make interdisciplinary connections
 - ❑ Become aware of the interpretative nature of knowledge
 - ❑ Consider that knowledge may place responsibilities on the knower
 - ❑ Understand the strengths and limitations of individual and cultural perspectives
 - ❑ Develop a concern for rigor in formulating knowledge claims
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Consider these TOK writing prompts:

- When mathematicians, historians and scientists say that they have explained something, are they using the word 'explain' in the same way?
 - Investigate the ways in which value judgments should and should not be used in the sciences.
 - Can literature "tell the truth" better than other Areas of Knowledge?
